MEMBERS PRESENT: Mary Mccoy, Katie Osinde, Alicia Spears, Christy Gail

VISITORS PRESENT: Alicia Gardner, Percy Butler - Parks Crew Leader, Glenn Caldwell - Director of Public Services

CALL TO ORDER: The meeting was called to order by Mary Mccoy at 6:05p.m.

DISCUSS AND CONSIDER APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES OF MARCH 16, 2016: Motion made by Alicia Spears to approve the minutes. Seconded by Christy Gail. Motion carried.

DISCUSS AND CONSIDER APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES OF APRIL 20, 2016: Motion made by Alicia Spears to approve the minutes. Seconded by Christy Gail. Motion carried.

DISCUSS AND CONSIDER PROPOSED ORDINANCE: The proposed ordinance was included in the packets. Glenn stated that there was a need to address fire arms at the parks. There were some federal changes on where you can carry fire arms, whether it was concealed, opened, licensed or non-licensed. The Assistant City Attorney reviewed our current ordinance to make sure we are following the current laws. There is some word changing that we needed to be clear on. In the past we did not include penalties for violating the ordinance that was set. We are now going to implement penalties for violators.

Assistant City Attorney, Greg Shumpert

- **Alcohol Consumption** - is prohibited in all parks under the current regulations. We have a lot of options; the prohibition that prohibits the use or consumption in all parks or allowing it in certain areas or have it by permission for special events with prior approval of the Director of Public Services or his designated staff. The Heritage Jubilee would be one event to consider. We thought this will be best to leave the recommendation to the Park Board.

Mary Mccoy - What will be the liability of the City if we approved alcohol for a certain event and someone get into a accident and pass away?

Assistant City Attorney - The City is not promoting, encouraging or selling alcohol so there will be no liabilities. Terrell Police Department will not be checking individuals to see if they are consuming alcohol. If a situation arises like public intoxication that will be a total different issue.

- **Hours of Operation** - The current ordinance provides hours for Ben Gill and Breezy Hill Park from Dawn to Midnight. We took Breezy Hill Park off because there is no lighting for the ball field. The poles were rotted and had to come down. We made all the neighborhood parks dawn to dusk. Individuals that have an event that will go past the hours, must acquire approval from the Director of Public Services or his designated staff. Terrell Police Department will be fully aware of the event. They will not decide if the event is approved or denied, they will be included only to be informed. They will provide services if needed, or if an issue arises.
- **Horseback riding** - is prohibited in all parks.
- **Enforcement Agency** - Terrell Police, the Director of Public Services and staff are allowed to enforce rule and regulations. They can ban individuals from the Park, if someone is disruptive or make them leave. The language in the old ordinance was not defined. The proposed ordinance does define who have authority to enforce regulations.
- **Skateboarding** -there was a section for bicycle riding, so we took that same section and added skateboarding. They are prohibited in certain areas. If individuals are seen on the tables with a skateboard is not in this section, but it is in the nuisance section.
- **No Hitting Golf Balls** - it is prohibited for safety concerns.
- **Fire Arms** - Our current regulation forbids fire arms in the Parks, which puts us at odds and conflict with the State Laws. We took that out and made different amendments that doesn't put us in conflict. We cannot post a sign at the Parks that prohibit fire arms, it would be against the law. If someone wants to shoot during their visit a the part, it is addressed in Section P. That includes stones, rockets, bow and arrow. All forms of shooting is all prohibited if it causes a hazard in anyway. We cannot lawfully forbid fire arms under current laws.
- **Penalties** - in the current ordinance there were specific penalties in certain sections. We took out the specific penalties and replaced it with a general penalty of anyone who violates any portion or revision of this can be fined up to \$500 for each offense.

A motion was made by Katie Osinde to approve the changes and present to the Council for approval. Seconded by Marcy Mccoy. Motion carried.

DISCUSS PARK MASTER PLAN: The City of Terrell's goal was to advertise a RFQ and receive respondents from consultants to focus on Ben Gill Park. We received nine respondents on the Ben Gill Park Master Plan. We will review those applications and then identify a short list of three to four. We will make contact with those on the short list to schedule a final interview. During the interview process we will score each of them, the one with the highest score will be the consultant that we select. The Park Board will not be able to sit in on the interviews, that is a City Staff responsibility. The Park Board will not have any impact on hiring a consultant.

There are two Master Plans: The Ben Gill Park Master Plan and the Comprehensive Master Plan that will include the neighborhood parks. The Comprehensive Plan will bring in a total different set of consultants. There will be two separate consultants working on both plans. The Boards initially wanted to do a overall Park Master Plan. Glenn advised that the Park Board and the City will work together to find a solutions to possibly consolidate. It was not the City's initial plan to separate the two projects in the beginning. If we move forward and the projects are not combined the City will have the two selected consultants to work together cohesively to provide a solution that would work. At this point we are working towards consolidating the two to build the best quality for the City.

DISCUSS ADULT SOFTBALL: Earlier in the year we decided to work with USSSA due to the fact that TARA resigned from managing Adult Softball. There has been no activity or response in forming a league under the new organization. We want to make preparations to come up with a better plan. We will bring this back to the Board at a later date.

UPDATE ON PARKS MAINTENANCE & REPAIR LIST: The City's Parks Department is about 95% complete with the list of projects provided by the members of the Park Board. A couple of the items require budgeting. The basketball court that has standing water is an item that we would have to carry forward to budget for funding. Replacing the backstops at the Baseball fields behind the home plate is a budget item. The signage is an ongoing process that we are working on. The list have been updated with comments. Our goal is to request enough money to put into the budget to repair the fencing at all the Parks. Glenn advised that the Park Board make a recommendation to budget a dollar amount for fence repair. The Park Board would like for Glenn Caldwell to take all the items that are marked as budget items to the Council to request funding.

Arlie White Park was not on the list. We need to make sure that it is added along with the repair request that were submitted.

The Park Board requested that the City look into shading for playground equipment.

UPDATE ON YOUTH RECREATION MANAGER: Mr. Edwards, the City Manager sent a statement regarding this item: "We have a pool of candidates. We are planning to start interviewing mid June. They will be interviewed by the Athletic Director of TISD and City Staff."

UPDATE ON USER FEES: Terrell Soccer Association (TSA) and Terrell Athletic Recreation Association (TARA) are current on their User Fees. Terrell Youth Athletic Association (TYAA) are new and have not had their first official season. We do not expect to receive any User Fees from them until after they have completed their registration and first game. The Adult Softball have not had anyone to register for either season.

There's a correction needed in calculation on the spreadsheet for the total 2016 User Fees that shows the dollar amount that has been collected over the years (\$22,140.00). The Board requested that the dates for payment received from TARA for 2015 to be confirmed at the future meeting.

DISCUSS MISCELLANEOUS ITEMS: Tim Royse submitted his resignation as a Park Board Member for a good reason. He won the City Council election for District 5. The Board has a copy of his resignation. Councilman Royse will now be the Council Member that sits in on the Park Board just as Councilman D.J. Ory did.

UPDATE ON SECURITY AND VANDALISM: None.

HEAR REMARKS FROM VISITORS:

Alicia Gardner: will the two consultants for both master plans be working at the same time if it is separated? Is there a deadline that will be set?

Glenn: yes but our goal is to have them work cohesively, together. There will be a deadline set. The City will not allow one consultant to become disconnected with the other. That's just courtesy of the work we do.

Glenn also provided the process for sending out Request For Qualifications along with the reviewing process of the applications.

Alicia Gardner: in the last meeting it was said that the consultants would be given a year or two to come up with a master plan for each park. How do you decide which park gets the funding? Will it still be Ben Gill Park on the top?

Glenn: that will not be decided until after we have reached a master plan. There will be a schedule of projects provided, then our budget will dictate which items can be done first on the list. Although an item might be listed on the top, it doesn't mean that that's the order we will follow.

Mary Mccoy: the current master plan we have is out dated. Which prevents us from requesting grants because we do not have the matching funds in our budget to complete the projects.

Glenn: all parks will receive equality of work. What needs to be done will vary from park to park but they will all get some attention.

Mary Mccoy: if Terrell starts building again, which we hope that it will happen when we pass the School Bond. The funds received will be additional revenue that is allocated for neighborhood parks that can only be spent at the park that serves the community in which a house is built in.

Glenn: Las Lomas is another development that will add an additional park once they start building houses.

Alicia Gardner: will the merry-go-round that was removed from Breezy Hill Park be replaced with something else? What can we do as a community to help with replacing it?

Glenn: contributions or donations are welcomed but our goal is to allow the best to determine what is best for the parks, which can be a year from now. If you're asking for us to deliver something in the next six months, we will look into what we can be done.

Alicia Gardner: suggested that the time for Breezy Hill be moved from dawn to 10:00pm once there are lights installed. We are interested in doing a fundraiser to help raise the funds for the lights. We want to know how many lights needed and the cost. If we raise the funds will the City be responsible for installing.

Glenn: the Assistant City Attorney could've addressed the time for Breezy Hill the best. The Park Board made a motion to change the time after the light poles had to come down. We will not make you wait a year but we will look for a replacement for the merry-go-round and the slide at Breezy Hill. We welcome donations and are glad that the individuals in the community desire to help.

Percy Butler: We had to remove the merry-go-round and the slide because of a safety issue. We will work on addressing the replacement and get the cost of installing the poles for lights at Breezy Hill ball field. We will provide the information at the next meeting.

ORDINANCE NO.2666

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF TERRELL, KAUFMAN COUNTY TEXAS, AMENDING CHAPTER 1, GENERAL PROVISIONS BY REPEALING SECTION 15, PARK REGULATIONS AND ADOPTING A NEW SECTION 1-15 PARK REGULATIONS; PROVIDING FOR REPEAL OF CONFLICTING ORDINANCES; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING A PENALTY AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TERRELL, KAUFMAN COUNTY, TEXAS THAT:

SECTION 1. Chapter 1, General Provisions, Section 15, Park Regulations, of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Terrell, Kaufman County, Texas is, hereby repealed in its entirety.

SECTION 2. That Chapter 1, General Provisions, is hereby amended by adopting a new Section 1-15 Park Regulations to read as follows

ARTICLE I.

Sec. 1-15: Park Regulations.

- (a) *Consumption of alcoholic beverages prohibited.* It shall be unlawful for any person to consume, or have in their possession, any alcoholic beverage in any City park, playground or recreational facility subject to the following exceptions:
- (1) During an event that is jointly sponsored by the City of Terrell and the Terrell Chamber of Commerce Convention and Visitor's Bureau scheduled in Ben Gill Park within specified areas; such events being limited to the Terrell Heritage Jubilee, 4th of July Celebration and North Texas Antique Tractor Show, and the event meets the following conditions:
- a. Written approval obtained from the Terrell Chief of Police prior to the event.
 - b. No consumption of alcoholic beverages in Ben Gill Park after 11:59 p.m. during the event.
 - c. No open display of identified alcoholic beverage containers allowed
 - d. No event shall exceed three (3) consecutive days in length.
 - d. The events subject to this exception shall not exceed a total of ten (10) days during any calendar year.
- (b) *Vehicular speed limit established in City parks.* It shall be unlawful for any person to drive or operate a motor vehicle at a speed greater than twenty (20) miles per hour unless otherwise posted in any city park, including but not limited to, all public parks owned or leased by the City of Terrell.
- (c) *Off-road vehicular traffic prohibited.* It shall be unlawful to park or operate any motorized vehicle in, over or through any park or recreational area except in, along or

upon designated streets, roads, or parking areas designated for vehicular traffic or parking unless otherwise permitted by the City Manager or his designee.

(d) *Camping prohibited.* It shall be unlawful to camp overnight in any park or recreational area within the City without prior approval of the City Manager or his designee unless it is related to a City of Terrell/Terrell Chamber of Commerce Convention and Visitor's Bureau sponsored event.

(e) *Overnight parking of mobile homes, recreational vehicles and/or commercial vehicles prohibited.* It shall be unlawful for any mobile home, camper, tent-trailer, motor home, or any other recreational vehicle with sleeping accommodations as well as any commercial vehicle to remain overnight in any park within the City of Terrell unless otherwise permitted by the City Manager or his designee or in connection with an approved event as set forth in subsection (a) (1) herein.

(f) *Hunting prohibited.* It shall be unlawful for any person to hunt, trap, molest or pursue any game or wild animals within the limits of any city park or recreational area.

(g) *Horseback riding prohibited.* It shall be unlawful for any person to ride a horse in any City park or recreational area unless it is related to a City of Terrell/Terrell Chamber of Commerce Convention and Visitor's Bureau sponsored event.

(h) *Swimming in City parks prohibited.* It shall be unlawful for any person to swim or wade in any lake or pond located within any City park or recreational area other than in the City swimming pool described in section 1-17 of this chapter.

(i) *Operational hours for City parks.* The following municipal parks, playgrounds, and recreational facilities within the City of Terrell shall be open for public use as indicated. Where approved activities may exceed the stated closing time, prior written approval must be obtained from the City Manager or his designee.

Breezy Hill Park	Dawn - Dusk
Kings Creek Park	Dawn - Dusk
Stallings Park	Dawn - Dusk
Arlie White Park	Dawn - Dusk

(j) *All persons shall abide by all rules and regulations.* The City Manager or his designee shall be authorized to post in conspicuous places written rules and regulations concerning prohibited or regulated conduct. Proof that a person in charge of a supervised play or amusement activity verbally informed an actor that his or her conduct was disruptive to said supervised activity shall be prima facie evidence that the actor willfully disrupted, prevented or hindered such supervised play or amusement program and that such act constituted a nuisance. Any such person accused of violating any rule or regulation may be expelled from all parks and recreational areas of the city for such time as the City Manager or his designee shall direct. Any person expelled from the public parks and

facilities of the City who comes upon any City park or recreational facility shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, subject to citation by a certified peace officer of the City of Terrell and, upon conviction, fined in accordance with the provisions of this section.

(k) *Disruption or interfering with park and recreational activities prohibited.*

(1) It shall be unlawful and hereby declared a nuisance for any person to willfully disrupt, prevent or hinder the orderly conduct of any supervised play or amusement program being conducted by or under the authority of the City Manager or his designee in any building, swimming pool, playground, or park area. "Supervised play or amusement program" shall include, but not be limited to, an organized activity where permission or authority for such activity is required from the City Manager or his designee for such activity, such as games of sport requiring specific areas of a facility or particular equipment and include, but not be limited to, baseball, softball, soccer, both practice and inter-team competition, swimming as well as other activities subject to control or authority of the City Manager of the City of Terrell.

(2) It shall also be unlawful for any person to remain in any building, swimming pool, ballfield, playground, or park area located in or on any public property within the city after being advised by the supervisor of a supervised play or amusement program being conducted by the public services department of the city in or on any public property that he or she is interfering with, disrupting or preventing the orderly conduct of such supervised play or amusement program and after having been asked to leave any building, swimming pool, playground, or park area located in or on any property within the City.

(l) *Use of park facilities.* It shall be unlawful in the establishment of park regulations, approval of private use of park facilities, or actual participation in private or public events in any City park to discourage or deny use of or access to park facilities by any person on the basis of such person's age, sex, race, national origin or sexual orientation.

(m) *Pets prohibited in designated areas.*

(1) When signs are posted giving notice to such effect, it shall be unlawful for any person owning or having control or custody of pets to permit or allow such pets to enter upon any portion of a City park, including but not limited to City/School district park sites, designated as an area prohibited to pets.

(2) The City Manager or his designee shall have the authority to designate portion of a City park, including City/school district park sites, as an area prohibited to pets by posting signs on one or more of the zone's boundaries.

(3) It is an exception to subsection (1) if:

- a. The dog is a police services animal under the supervision of a police officer in the performance of his official duties; or
- b. The dog is a “service pet” performing duties of assisting the disabled.

(n) *Bicycle riding and/or skate boarding in City parks.* Bicycle riding and/or skate boarding in parks shall be governed by safe practices and consideration for the use of park areas by others. Bicycle riding and skate boarding shall be allowed on public streets and walking paths and shall be unlawful and an offense within and around playgrounds, picnic areas, special display areas, on tennis and athletic courts, in and around pavilion or other monument type structures, or in and around any area where other activities are in progress.

(o) *Hitting golf balls or engaging in golf practice in City parks prohibited.* When signs are posted giving notice to such effect, it shall be unlawful and an offense for any person to hit or drive golf balls in and upon public parks within the City.

(p) *Projectiles prohibited.* No person shall throw, shoot, propel or discharge any bullet, stone, arrow, rocket or any object which could create a hazard or danger to the public within any park unless it is related to a City of Terrell/Terrell Chamber of Commerce Convention and Visitor’s Bureau sponsored event or prior written approval by City Manager.

(q) *Penalty.* Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions or terms of this section shall be deemed to be guilty of a Class C misdemeanor and upon conviction in the Municipal Court shall be punished by a fine not to exceed \$500.00 for each offense.

ARTICLE II.

All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby repealed.

ARTICLE III.

It is hereby declared to be the intention of the City Council that the sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses, and phrases of this Ordinance are severable and, if any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, or section of this Ordinance shall be declared unconstitutional by the valid judgement or decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, such unconstitutionality shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs, and sections of this Ordinance, since the same would have been enacted by the City Council without the incorporation in this Ordinance of any such unconstitutional phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, or section.

ARTICLE IV.

This Ordinance will take effect immediately from and after its passage and the publication

of the caption as the law in such cases provides.
