

**ORDINANCE NO. 2069**

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TERRELL, TEXAS, AGRICULTURE (A) TO PLANNED DEVELOPMENT RESIDENTIAL (PD) FOR PROPERTY DESCRIBED AS 21.755 ACRES OF THE J.C. HALE SURVEY, ABSTRACT 202, TERRELL, TEXAS; AND AMENDING “EXHIBIT A; DESCRIPTION OF PLANNED DEVELOPMENT” OF ORDINANCE NO. 2024 BY ADDING SAID TRACT TO EXHIBIT; PROVIDING FOR THE REPEAL OF CONFLICTING ORDINANCES; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.**

**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TERRELL, TEXAS:**

**ARTICLE I.**

**WHEREAS**, the City Council of the City of Terrell, Texas held a public hearing on May 15, 2001, on a request to change the zoning from Agriculture (A) to Planned Development Residential (PD) for property described below.

**WHEREAS**, the City Council has determined that all notice requirements have been given in compliance with the laws and ordinances of the City of Terrell, Texas; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council of the City of Terrell, Texas has determined that it would be in the best interest of the citizens of Terrell to change the zoning from Agriculture (A) to Planned Development Residential (PD) for property described below.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the City Council of the City of Terrell, Texas:

**THAT** the zoning classification be and is hereby changed from Agriculture (A) to Planned Development Residential (PD) for property described as 21.755 acres of the J.C. Hale Survey, Abstract 202, and amend “Exhibit A” Description of Planned Development, of Ordinance No. 2024, by adding said of tract to exhibit.

Said zoning being based on the attached “Exhibit A” - Description of Planned Development.

**ARTICLE II.**

All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby repealed.

**ARTICLE III.**

It is hereby declared to be the intention of the City Council that the sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses, and phrases of this Ordinance are severable and, if any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, or section of this Ordinance shall be declared unconstitutional by the valid judgment or decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, such unconstitutionality shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs, and sections of this Ordinance, since the same would have been enacted by the City Council without the incorporation in this ordinance of any such unconstitutional phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, or section.

**ARTICLE IV.**

This ordinance will take effect immediately from and after its passage and the publication of the caption as the law in such cases provides.
