

ORDINANCE NO. 2113

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF TERRELL, TEXAS,
AMENDING CHAPTER 11, SECTION 42 (H) OF THE CODE OF
ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF TERRELL, DESIGNATING
RESERVED HANDICAP PARKING SPACES ON PUBLIC
PROPERTY, ESTABLISHING A PENALTY AND ESTABLISHING
AN EFFECTIVE DATE.**

**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TERRELL, TEXAS
that:**

SECTION I.

Chapter 11, Traffic Regulations, Section 11-42, Parking Restrictions, Subsection H, Handicapped Parking is hereby amended to read as follows:

1. The following public parking locations are designated as reserved handicapped parking spaces in the city:
 - (a) One space located on the West side of the 100 block of North Adelaide, 80 feet South of the centerline of Nash Street.
 - (b) One space located on the West side of the 100 block of South Adelaide, 80 feet South of the centerline of Moore Avenue.
 - (c) One space located on the East side of the 100 block of South Adelaide, 150 feet South of the centerline of Moore Avenue.
 - (d) One space located on the West side of the 100 block of North Catherine, 100 feet South of the centerline of Nash Street.
 - (e) One space located on the East side of the 100 block of North Catherine, 140 feet South of the centerline of Nash Street.
 - (f) One space located on the West side of the 100 block of North Catherine, 130 feet North of the centerline of Moore Avenue.
 - (g) One space located on the West side of the 100 block of South Catherine, 80 feet South of the centerline of Moore Avenue.
 - (h) One space located on the West side of the 100 block of North Frances, 60 feet South of the centerline of Nash Street.
 - (i) One space located on the North side of the 100 block of West Nash, 95 feet East of the centerline of Frances Street.

- (j) Two spaces located at the Terrell Public Library, approximately 95 feet North of the centerline of High Street and approximately 100 feet West of the centerline of Rockwall Avenue.
- (k) One space located at the Terrell Municipal Building, approximately 54 feet North of the centerline of Nash Street and approximately 54 feet East of the centerline of Adelaide Street.
- (l) Two spaces located on the North side of the 100 block of West Brin, 80 feet West of the centerline of Catherine Street.
- (m) One space located on the West side of the 100 block of South Frances, 80' feet South of centerline of Moore Avenue.

2. Each reserved handicapped parking space shall be marked as required by Article 6675a-5e-1 of the Texas Revised Civil Statutes.
3. Any vehicle upon which disabled license plate devices, as defined in Article 6675a-5e-1, are displayed or in which a disabled person identification card is placed in the lower left-hand side of the front windshield, when being operated by or for the transportation of a disabled person shall be allowed to park for unlimited periods in any parking space or parking area designated specifically for the physically handicapped.
4. No person shall park a vehicle neither displaying the special device plate or displaying a disabled person identification card in a parking space or parking area designated for the disabled.
5. No person who is not temporarily or permanently disabled nor transporting a temporarily or permanently disabled person shall park a vehicle with such special device or displaying a disabled person identification card in a parking space or parking area designated specially for the disabled.

SECTION II.

That penalties for violations of this ordinance shall be the same as provided for in Section 1-5 of the code of Ordinances of the City of Terrell, Texas.

SECTION III.

That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby repealed.

SECTION IV.

That it is hereby declared to be the intention of the city council that the sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses, and phrases of this ordinance are severable and, if any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, or section of this ordinance shall be declared unconstitutional by the valid judgment or decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, such unconstitutionality shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs, and sections of this ordinance, since the same would have been enacted by the City Council without the incorporation in this ordinance of any such unconstitutional phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, or section.

SECTION V.

That this ordinance will take effect immediately from and after its passage and publication as the law in such cases provides.
