

A Message From the Chief of Police:

From the start of this fiscal year, we have trended downward in our index offense percentages. April shows us down 30% in overall index numbers from the beginning of the fiscal year. We trended up 4% from March due to an increase in burglaries, thefts and motor vehicle thefts. Just a reminder that many of these thefts can be prevented by locking your vehicles and securing valuables out of sight.

April showed a significant percentage increase in violent crimes, up 450% over March. However, a closer look reveals that we average 9.4 violent crimes per month this fiscal year. March was an exception to this with only two. April ended with 11 violent crimes 9 more than March. When dealing with small numbers, small increases cause large changes in percentages.

Overall, we are trending downward. Together as partners, we can keep this downward trend and keep Terrell a safe place to live and work.
